Under 1,749 square feet; and Best Product Design, Townhome Under 1,499 square feet. They capped that off with Most Outstanding Kitchen in a Home Under 2,499 square feet, Best In-House Sales Centre and Best Sales Brochure.

In what was billed as the Millennium Awards, recognizing outstanding construction for the year 1999, the HHHBA conducted the three-hour festivities with four Master of Ceremonies — the perennial favorite, Bud Sinclair, Angela Coyne-Maylor, Andy Kosior, and Lee-Anne Creery, chair of the Sales and Mar-



keting Council. The evening was punctuated by memorable tunes from energetic Legends performer and Tom Jones impersonator Joe Callura — he of the swivelling hips, the roving feet, and the wandering eye.

Marz Homes rode a wave to five sepa-

rate awards for a pair of trend-setting enclaves in Stoney Creek — on the shores of Lake Ontario. Seaside Village, a collection of townhomes based on a theme of New Urbanism, washed away the competition in four categories. Topping the Marz awards was an honour

Single Family Home over 2,950 square feet — also in Tyandaga West — and the third for Best Custom Home.

Multi-Area Developments took the honours for Best Product Design. Single Family Home 2,350 square feet to 2,949 square feet for the Renaissance 2000 at Valley Park Ravines in Stoney Creek.

Kabinet Pro cleaned up with Most Outstanding Kitchen in a Home 2,500 square feet and over; and Most Outstanding Bathroom in a Home 2,500 square feet and over. Monarch Construction won Most Outstanding Bathroom in a Home Under 2,499 square feet, while Jay Robinson retained his stranglehold on custom designs — this one for Most Outstanding Exterior in a Home 2,500 square feet and over.
